## He finally did it!: Scrat from 'Ice Age' gets a heartwarming send-off video

**Scrat** , the beloved squirrel from "**Ice Age**" who chased an elusive acorn throughout the series of films produced by **Blue Sky Studios** , a studio that closed its doors, finally got what he longed for and had a very emotional ending.

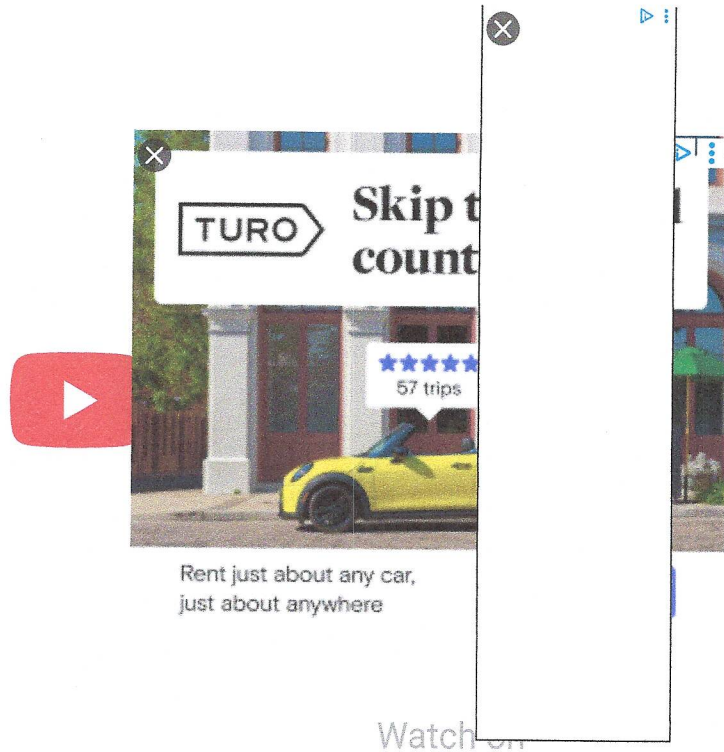
And the squirrel will no longer be part of **Disney** , as it ceased to own the trademark for the character after the legal battle that **Ivy Silberstein** won on January 28 , so a video was recently leaked in which he is given an emotional farewell.

A video titled "**The End**" recently began circulating on **YouTube** , showing Scrat **finally enjoying his acorn** after suffering for many years.

The images were allegedly developed by the animators at Blue Sky, who recently came together to offer a farewell to the character on their own terms.



The video description reads: ***"In the final days of Blue Sky Studios, a small group of artists came together for one last shot. This shot is a farewell on our terms."*** If it is indeed the work of the studio's animators, it could signify the end of an era that has been with us for 20 years.

## What happened to Scrat?

One of the most beloved animated characters in children's cinema will disappear from upcoming **"Ice Age"** productions after **Disney** and **Fox** lost a lawsuit in favor of its copyright.

The American cartoonist Ivy Silberstein won the rights to the character she drew in 1999 for the 20th Century Fox network, which now belongs to Disney and which, in 2002, released Ice Age, so, since then, Ivy began the legal battle for ownership of the character that represents a combination between a rat and a squirrel.

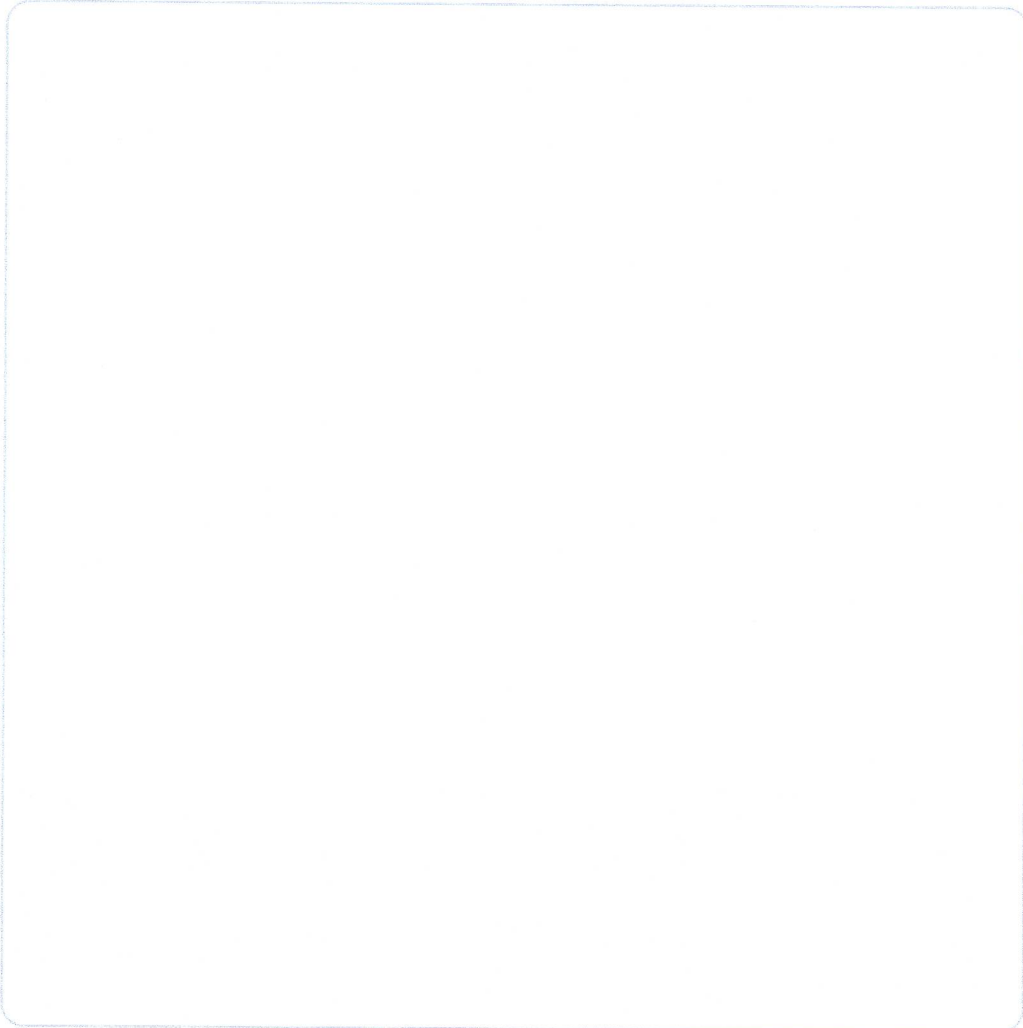
Now, 20 years later, the end of this long process finally materialized on January 28, 2022, when Silberstein announced that he had "won the battle" and regained exclusive ownership of the rights to the character.
